
The Division I trophy is named after the long time Florida A&M Director of Bands Dr. William P. Foster.

Under the leadership of visionary, Dr. Kenneth Ruff, "The Blue and Gold Machine" brings crowds of fans to their feet year after year. The hard work of band members has led to numerous recognitions such as winners of the Honda Battle of The Bands, official band of the Carolina Panthers NFL franchise, the lead band for the 2012 Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade in New York City, participants in the 2024 Tournament of Roses Parade in Pasadena, California, and winners of the 2023 ESPN Band of the Year.

The band performs at a variety of school and community functions and consists of approximately 250 members from very diverse majors and concentrations. The band is an auditioned group. DIRECTOR OF BANDS NORTH CAROLINA A&T STATE UNIVERSITY

Kenneth Ruff is the Director of University Bands at North Carolina A&T State University. His Band duties include directing the Marching Band, Wind Ensemble, Symphonic Band, and Pep Band. Additional duties within the Music Program at A&T include directing the University Flute Choir, Saxophone Choir, Clarinet Choir, and teaching Applied Flute, Clarinet, and Saxophone lessons. Ruff is responsible for the organization and planning of the band program.

Ruff holds a bachelor's degree in Music Education and Masters Degree in Educational Administration and Supervision from North Carolina A&T State University. He also holds a master's degree in Music Education, a Specialist degree in Education, and a doctorate in Education from the University of North Carolina at Greensboro.

Prior to becoming the Director of University Bands at North Carolina A&T State University, Ruff served as an Assistant Principal at Eastern Guilford High School in the Guilford County School System. He also served as an Assistant Director of Bands for North Carolina A&T State University on a part-time basis. Ruff served as Director of Bands at Eastern Guilford High School and McLeansville Middle School and an Associate Director of Bands at John Motley Morehead High School and Holmes Middle School in Eden, North Carolina.

Professional affiliations include the North Carolina Association of School Administrators, Guilford County Association of Educators, Association for Supervision and Curriculum Development, North Carolina Association of Educators, Historically Black Colleges and Universities National Band Directors Consortium, Music Educators National Conference, Central District Bandmasters Association, and the Rockingham County Bandmasters Association.

Ruff has served as an adjudicator for high school marching band competitions on the east coast. He has served as a clinician and director for the Rockingham County, Cumberland County, Lee County, and Guilford County All-County Bands and the University of North Carolina at Greensboro Summer Music Camp. Ruff has also been selected to Who's Who Among America's Teachers and received an Outstanding Achievement Award from the School of Education at the University of North Carolina at Greensboro and The William C. Friday Lifetime Achievement Award for the University of North Carolina Association of Student Governents.

Ruff is a member of Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia Professional Fraternity of Music, Kappa Kappa Psi National Honorary Band Fraternity, Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Inc., and Tau Beta Sigma National Honorary Band Fraternity.



Unveiled in 2020 amidst the challenges of a global pandemic, The ROAR quickly emerged as a beacon of hope, captivating both the local community and the nation at large.

Under the visionary leadership of the esteemed Dr. Richard Beckford, a legendary educator and arranger boasting over three decades of experience, The ROAR has transcended traditional expectations. Dr. Beckford, a luminary in building stellar band programs and cultivating successful leaders, answered the call to join the FMU Family, aligning with University President Dr. Jaffus Hardrick's ambitious vision of ascending to excellence.

In its inaugural year, The ROAR Marching Band achieved unparalleled success, securing ESPN's coveted #1 Rank for Division II HBCU marching bands nationwide. This remarkable feat underscored the band's commitment to excellence and set the stage for a series of triumphs. The international stage beckoned, and The ROAR proudly represented the United States as the first college band to grace France's iconic B'andafolies week-long festival, garnering acclaim as an international fan favorite.

Beyond the music, The ROAR has etched its name in history with prestigious performances for luminaries such as President Joe Biden and Vice President Kamala Harris, as well as captivating audiences at major sports events for the Miami Heat, Florida Marlins, and Florida Panthers. Their artistry extends beyond live performances, with notable appearances in music videos and a cinematic debut in the 2023 release "Bobby's Kids."

Beyond the stage, The ROAR's meteoric rise is mirrored in their online presence, amassing millions of impressions through social media channels, YouTube, and their website. As one of the most watched bands of the decade, The ROAR's captivating performances transcend the traditional, ushering in a new era of musical excellence and solidifying their status as cultural trailblazers.







DR. SHELBY CHIPMAN DIRECTOR OF BANDS FLORIDA A&M UNIVERSITY

Shelby Chipman, Ph.D. is professor of music and director of bands at Florida A&M University (FAMU.) He received his Bachelor of Science degrees in Computer Science and Music Education from FAMU, completed his master's degree in music education from the University of Illinois, and received his Ph.D. in Music Education from Florida State University, where his dissertation study focused on At-Risk Music Students and how middle & high school band programs encouraged students to stay in school. Dr. Chipman's responsibilities include marching & pep bands, wind symphony, symphonic band, conducting, instrumental methods, and string ensemble. Since his appointment as Director of Bands in 2016, the FAMU Wind Symphony has been invited to perform at numerous festivals and conventions, to include the FMEA Professional Development Conference in Tampa, FL, Carnegie Hall in New York City, and the 2023 CB DNA National Conference in Athens, GA. The Incomparable Marching 100 also performed in the LeBron James Chosen One's basketball tournament in Los Angeles, CA. The FAMU Incomparable Marching 100 performed for the 2021 "We Are One" Presidential Inauguration" performance, and the 2019 Tournament of Roses Parade in Pasadena, CA and numerous other events.

Dr. Chipman has become an advocate of new music and the FAMU band program has participated in commissioning projects and premieres. He is active as an adjudicator, clinician, and guest conductor through the United States. In 2019, Dr. Chipman was elected to membership in the prestigious American Bandmasters Association. He is a member of the College Band Directors National Association, Florida Bandmasters Association, (former district chair), National Band Association, National Association for Music Education, Florida Music Education Association, Phi Beta Mu, Kappa Kappa Psi National Honorary Band Fraternity, and Phi Mu Alpha/Sigma Alpha lota Music organizations, to name a few. Dr. Chipman was appointed a member of the Midwest Clinic advisory board. Dr. Chipman is a faculty member of Music for All National Music Festivals. He is a Conn-Selmer Educational Clinician, and the Immediate Past-President of Florida Music Education Association (FMEA). Dr. Chipman is also a member of the John Phillip Sousa Foundation's Sudler Trophy committee, which selects the most outstanding collegiate marching band in the country. He's an active adjudicator of concert bands and presents clinics throughout the country. Dr. Chipman also conducts the Big Bend Community Orchestra here in Tallahassee.

Prior to his appointment at FAMU, Dr. Chipman was director of bands at Miami Central high school, where he was selected the 1994 teacher of the year, and his bands consistently earned Superior ratings during evaluations. His symphonic band performed in the Bands of America National Concert Festival in Indianapolis, IN and his marching band performed in the 1997 Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade in New York City. Dr. Chipman is married to Detrick LaShawn and together they have one son, Israel. "As educators, it is our responsibility to encourage students to maintain their focus in school. We must be diligent in bringing out the best in students, each day we open our classroom doors."



DR. TAYLOR L. WHITEHEAD DIRECTOR OF BANDS VIRGINIA STATE UNIVERSITY

Dr. Taylor L. Whitehead, a native of Meherrin, Virginia, currently serves as the Director of Marching and Pep Bands at Virginia State University. Dr. Whitehead received his Bachelor of Science in Music Education from Virginia State University, a Master of Music Education from Norfolk State University, and a Doctor of Music Education from Liberty University. From 1997-2018, he served as the Band Director at Warren County High School in Warrenton, North Carolina. Under his leadership, the Warren County High School "Dynamic Marching Machine" became one of the most successful show-style marching bands in North Carolina and throughout the nation. Between 2006 and 2017, the Warren County Band won nine National High Stepping Drumline Championships, seven Class A National High Stepping Band Championships, two National Danceline Championships, two National Auxiliary Championships, five Class A State High Stepping Band Championships, as well as over one hundred 1st Place Drumline Trophies.

In 2013, Dr. Whitehead returned to his alma mater to serve part-time as the Assistant Band Director at Virginia State University. In 2018, he became the full-time Assistant Band Director at VSU. He was named Interim Director of Bands in 2022. In addition to working with the band program, he is a Department of Music faculty member. Dr. Whitehead is very active in several collegiate organizations, including the HBCU Band Directors' Consortium, where he is an Executive Board Member, and the Intercollegiate Music Association. He also serves on the Board of Directors for The Cadets Drum and Bugle Corps. He has served as President of the North Carolina Show-style Band Director's Association and advisor to the National Board for High Stepping Nationals and the Grand Board for Tuba Phi Tuba Brass Fellowship. He was named the 2011 Warren County High School Teacher of the Year and the Spectacular Magazine "Man of the Year" in Education for 2013. In 2023, the Petersburg Alumnae Chapter of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Incorporated selected Dr. Whitehead as their Trailblazer of the Year for Educational Development. Dr. Whitehead is also an Amazon best-selling author as one of the co-authors of The HBCU Experience, The HBCU Band Alumni Edition.

Dr. Whitehead is a member of Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity Incorporated, Kappa Kappa Psi National Band Fraternity, Tau Beta Sigma National Honorary Band Service Sorority, Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia, Tuba Phi Tuba Brass Fellowship, Mu Phi Sigma National Percussion Fraternity, Phi Delta Kappa International Association, and Omega Nu Lambda.



Performing for audiences exceeding 100,000 people annually, the band fosters school spirit, pride, and enthusiasm throughout the Miles College community.

Known for its energetic approach to football entertainment, the "Purple Marching Machine" delivers thrilling drills, dynamic dance routines, and high-quality musical performances that captivates the audience. As an exhibition band, the "Purple Marching Machine" has participated in numerous high profile events, including Marching Band Festivals, NFL games, NBA games, PGA events, Pepsi National Battle of the Bands, Honda Battle of the Bands, High School Evaluations, Queen City Battle of the Bands, and Percussion Performance in the 2019 Rose Bowl. Notably, the band had the honor of performing in the 2002 Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade in New York City.

The "Purple Marching Machine" is dedicated to maintaining superior musical performance standards, continuously pursuing innovated and groundbreaking artistic expressions. It strives to set the benchmark for excellence among marching bands nationwide, establishing itself as a model of inspiration and achievement for others to follow.

WILLIE J. SNIPES, JR. DIRECTOR OF BANDS MILES COLLEGE

Professor Willie James Snipes, Jr., is the Director of College Bands at Miles College. Prior to his current role, he served as the Assistant Director of Bands at Miles College for five years, building a distinguished career that paved the way for his leadership.

A native of Birmingham, Alabama, Professor Snipes attended Woodlawn High School, where he became the student director in 1999 and was named Most Outstanding Band Member in 2000. He later attended Miles College, where he became an active member of the Purple Marching Machine (PMM), participating in the marching band, pep band, concert band, and jazz band. In 2002, he served as student director, where his responsibilities included assisting with band camps, managing budgets, drill writing, arranging, and conducting music. Notably, Professor Snipes became the first music graduate in Miles College's history and later earned a Master's degree in Educational Leadership from National-Louis University.

In 2006, Professor Snipes moved to Tampa, Florida, where he served as Director of Bands at Van Buren Middle School and Assistant Band Director at Plant High School. Under his leadership, his bands achieved Superior ratings for five consecutive years at the Florida Bandmasters Association Assessment. In 2009, he was honored with the "Tom Bishop" Award for significant improvements in his band's performance. Returning to Birmingham in 2011, Professor Snipes revitalized the Jackson-Olin High School band program. That same year, the "Mean Green Marching Machine" won Grand Champion at the 14th Annual Southeast Region Battle of the Bands and earned Superior ratings at the BCS Magic City Marching Band Festival. On April 6, 2016, his birthday, Professor Snipes was appointed Director of College Bands at Miles College. Under his leadership, the Purple Marching Machine has earned national acclaim, participating in prestigious events such as the National Battle of the Bands, Honda Battle of the Bands, Rose Bowl Parade, and Queen City Battle of the Bands. The band was named 2018 ESPN Band of the Year and achieved further recognition for its excellence and showmanship.

Professor Snipes serves as Vice President of the SIAC Band Directors Board and is a proud member of numerous professional organizations, including the National Band Association (NBA), Alabama Bandmasters Association (ABA), Florida Bandmasters Association (FBA), National Association for Music Education (NAfME), Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia, Kappa Kappa Psi, and Tau Beta Sigma. Additionally, he is a 33rd Degree Prince Hall Affiliated Free and Accepted Mason.

Professor Snipes is the son of Willie Sr. and the late Emma Snipes. He is a devoted father to his daughter, Emma Snipes, and has a sister, Karen Brooks, along with three nieces. His contributions to music education and band performance continue to leave a lasting impact on the Miles College community and beyond.




